The IABA was incorporated in 1935 when we moved to our current location and was owned by the individuals of the Italian Athletic Club (IAC). Today, the Club itself owns 75% of all shares of the building with individuals making up the balance. The



IABA is responsible for management and care of our facility and the shareholders elect them to their positions annually.



JOIN THE SFIAC

It is the Club's goal to promote Italian culture and to bring in new members so that the SFIAC can continue to be the premier Italian men's club in the Bay Area for another 100 years and beyond.

The Membership committee wants to make the process of bringing new members into the Club as easy as possible. Here is all you need to do: Visit www.sfiac.org > Membership or scan the code, below, to get started.



The Membership committee has been hard at work on the application process and ideas to make the Club better for you. And if you see new faces at the Club, don't be afraid to introduce yourself, learn about the new member, and continue to spread Italian heritage to your fellow paisanos.

Do you need to be 100% Italian to join?

No, we just need to see that you have Italian heri tage on at least one side of you family.

Do you need to have an Italian last name?

No, we have plenty of members whose Italian heritage comes from their mother's side.

Do you need to live in North Beach to join?

No, you can join regardless of where you live. Members who live more than 50 miles from the Club can opt to be Associate members.

How can I show my Italian heritage to join?

If you don't have an Italian last name, usually you can show it on a birth certificate or baptismal certificate. The membership team can help advise on what you should do if that will not work for you.

Do you need to personally know a member of the Club to join?

The application requires you to have a sponsor who is a Regular or Lifetime member. You will also need to have the names of **two other Club members** to put on your application. The membership team can help you get this done.

I let my membership expire. May I re-join?

Yes, wealways welcome backprevious members who left in good standing. Please contact the Membership team committee to get your application back on track to re-join.

2022 DUES RENEWAL AND GLUEUP

We have implemented our new membership portal, GlueUp. Club Information

We have many new members and members that have spent some time away from the Club. Here are some answers to frequently asked questions.

- Stag dinners and Cigar and Steak Nights are for members and their male guests.

- Stag: All new members receive their first Stag free. Email gina@sfiac.org to sign up. When purchasing tickets, you may state your seating preference or default to "new members" or "no preference".

- Unless otherwise noted, theme/regional dinners, mid-month dinners (crab night, prime rib, spring rabbit) are open to members and their guests (male or female). There is not an age requirement; but, please use your best judgment as they are evening events and not geared towards children.

- There will be an Easter brunch event the weekend before Easter. The event is for families and will have adult and kids pricing.

- Members' Bar: Every Friday (unless otherwise noted) there is a complimentary buffet in the Members' Bar. The meal is put out at approximately 6 p.m. It is first come first served and not replenished. Members may bring up to 6 guests to the Members' Bar at any time. Per our license, there is no age requirement to be present in the Bar.

- Members' are free to use the balcony off of the Park View room during Club hours whenever there is not an event in the space. Members may not enter the Park View room when there is an event in progress.

- Any member may request early or off day Club access to use the gym. We can adjust your keycard and provide security information.

- The Club is closed to members on Sunday and Monday.

- Club office hours are Monday to Friday approximately 9:30-6pm depending on other events such as Club meetings and Stag.

- We hope to bring back our Italian language classes as soon as possible. We are in the process of relaunching the program. Classes will offer member and guest pricing.

Nominations, Elections for Officers and Directors

*Please note the election process may be altered after the upcoming November bylaws meeting

It's time to select our officers and directors for 2022! Article VI, Section I, B, of the Club Bylaws states: "Nominations for all offices, Board of Directors, Board of Trustees and Club Officers, shall be open to the general membership at a special meeting on the first and second Tuesday in January. Nominees must be present to accept or decline their nomination."

As many of the board seats will be vacant and some board members cannot run again, this year's election is extremely important.

Article VI, Section 2, B of the Club's Bylaws states:

"Ballots must be cast at the Club premises between the hours of 1:30 PM and 9:00 PM." For additional Bylaws election information, visit www. *sfiac.org*.

Your participation in nominations and elections is crucial for the Club to function. This is the one Club function that **all members should attend**, if only to meet the candidates. Please mail in your ballot or plan to be at the Club to vote. All members will receive a ballot in the mail – please be sure the Club office has your current mailing address! You do not need to physically cast your ballot on-site on election day, but may still do so if you like. All ballots must be filled out and received by the SFIAC on or before January 25, 2022.

Strict Voting Procedures

A. No candidate, for any office, shall solicit votes in writing and any candidate so doing shall be disqualified and his name removed from the ballot. Any and all candidates for all offices may solicit for votes prior to election day. No candidate may solicit votes on the day of the election or within 100 feet of the premises. Any candidate found violating this article would automatically be disqualified from the election

B. Mailings are sent to members and handled in the following manner to insure security and privacy:1) Each member is assigned a number.

- 2) Each mailing will contain the following:
 - a. Ballot
 - b. Return envelope

c. Ballot envelope (a smaller return envelope with stamped number assigned per instruction #1 above.)

3) Each member completes ballot.

4) Each member submits ballot in either of the two following ways:

a. Member drops off in person his sealed ballot envelope with ballot enclosed into election ballot box.

b. Member mails sealed ballot envelope - with marked ballot enclosed - inside of pre-addressed return envelope.

5) At the time ballot envelopes are received, either by mail or in person at the Club, the number assigned to the member is checked off.

6) All sealed ballot envelopes are inserted into the election ballot box.

7) All ballots must be submitted and inserted into the election ballot box by 9:00 PM on election day.

IMPORTANT: Member should not have his name on ballot or on the ballot envelope for anonymous voting.

SFIAC FOUNDATION

The SFIAC Foundation had a busy end to the year thanks to the support from Club members, the neighborhood community, Foundation directors, and the strategic

planning committee. We will highlight just two of the signature events that occurred starting with the September 28 painting of the poles in North Beach. Randy DeMartini and Nick Figone recruited and organized 52 volunteers to paint 107 poles in the neighborhood with the "trecolori" after purchasing gallons of primer, paint, brushes, rollers, and color matching the existing paint scheme. Of course, the hardest part of painting is the prep, which in this instance was the two years of negotiating with multiple city agen-

cies to win the approval to move forward with the painting project. The neighborhood looked fresh and crisp just in time for the Italian Heritage Parade. Business owners were approaching our volunteers asking them to paint the poles in front of their shops. Needless to say the neighborhood response was overwhelming and the Foundation will lead another painting day to hit the poles south of Vallejo Street

November 17 which was attended by nearly 40 participants. The retreat capped a 10-month planning process which included numerous meetings and Zoom presentations with support from an outside consultant reporting to the Foundation board of directors. The November 17 retreat featured a memorable presentation from Ciro Poppiti and Jeff Santoro who are executive producers of the documentary Big City Little Italy. These men, along with brother Nic Santoro, interviewed nearly a dozen

Little Italys around the US and presented their findings in a thoughtful analysis tailored for North Beach. They presented a SWOT analysis and made recommendations on how to keep North Beach Italian which is one of the strategic pillars for the Foundation. Attendees are still buzzing about their presentation and we look forward to carrying this momentum into the new year as the strategic plan is finalized.

100th Statuto Race makes history for a variety of reasons!

The 100th Statuto Race took place on October 24. Originally scheduled for June, 2020, the event was rescheduled a number of times due to Covid 19. Eager to make the 100th running of the event extra special, the Statuto Race committee pushed forward with the planning process for close to two years. Great care was taken to host an event that was still in the spirit of preceding events even though extensive Covid 19 safety protocols had to be followed. As the race day approached, we had reached our capacity of 300 runners and walkers, making it the largest Statuto Race in recent memory. We expected to see all 300 participants on the starting line, but Mother Nature delivered an atmospheric river to the Bay Area the morning of the race causing almost 50% of the runners to stay home. 




