

It is the Club's goal to promote Italian culture and to bring in new members so that the SFIAC can continue to be the premier Italian men's club in the Bay Area for another 100 years and beyond.

The Membership committee wants to make the process of bringing new members into the Club as easy as possible. Here is all you need to do: Visit www.sfiac.org > Membership or scan the code, below, to get started.



The Membership committee has been hard at work on the application process and ideas to make the Club better for you. And if you see new faces at the Club, don't be afraid to introduce yourself, learn about the new member, and continue to spread Italian heritage to your fellow paisanos.

Do you need to be 100% Italian to join?

No, we just need to see that you have Italian heritage on at least one side of you family.

Do you need to have an Italian last name?

No, we have plenty of members whose Italian heritage comes from their mother's side.

Do you need to live in North Beach to join?

No, you can join regardless of where you live. Members who live more than 50 miles from the Club can opt to be Associate members.

How can I show my Italian heritage to join?

If you don't have an Italian last name, usually you can show it on a birth certificate or baptismal certificate. The membership team can help advise on what you should do if that will not work for you.

Do you need to personally know a member of the Club to join?

The application requires you to have a sponsor who is a Regular or Lifetime member. You will also need to have the names of **two other Club members** to put on your application. The membership team can help you get this done.

I let my membership expire. May I re-join?

Yes, we always welcome back previous members who left in good standing. Please contact the Membership team committee to get your application back on track to re-join.

You don't know until you ask. You can start at our website www.sfiac.org > Membership

Do I need to be an athlete to join?

You do not need to be an athlete to join.

2023 Membership Dues

We have updated our membership renewal process. We apologize for all the difficulty with the online process in 2022. We are working to ensure a smoother process for 2023. The Board of Directors has set 2023 dues at the following rate: regular membership will be \$480/year, associate membership \$130 and lifetime will remain \$145.

In order to renew your membership for 2023, dues are due by December 31, 2022. There will be a grace period until January 31, 2023. Members who pay dues on or after February 1, 2023, will be subject to a \$40 late fee. If dues are not paid by March 1, 2023, membership cards will be deactivated and you will need to pay a membership reactivation fee of \$75. Dues can be paid online through Glue-Up, calling The Club with a credit card, or mailing a check. Please make sure checks are made out to "The San Francisco Italian Athletic Club" and mail to P.O. Box 330154, San Francisco, CA 94133.

You will be receiving emails directly from Glue-Up with instructions on how to pay dues in December. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email keely@sfiac.org or call our office at 415-781-0166.

NOTE: Lifetime members will receive a dues notice in the mail. If you are a member paying dues on a monthly billing cycle, please disregard this message. We will adjust your prices accordingly.



History of the Program: Founded in 2000, by the generous financial support of Ambassador Peter F. Secchia, the Voyage of Discovery aims to strengthen the Italian American identity, the Italian American community and its connection with Italy including its culture and people.

About the Program: The Voyage of Discovery is an educational trip that travels to NIAF's Region of Honor, which changes every year. Explore iconic Italian cities and towns, tour ancient sites, and enjoy mouthwatering cuisine. Get up-close and



personal with local culture and make memories that will last a lifetime. Each trip also includes a day of community service. While the 2023 Region of Honor has yet to be determined, the trip will kick off in Rome for the first four days of trip. Past locations include Abruzzo, Puglia, Campania, Sicily, Calabria, Liguria, Umbria and Tuscany.

Eligibility:

- Must be a full-time college student at a college or university for the semester preceding the trip
- Between the ages of 18-23 at the time of travel
- Of Italian heritage
- Never previously visited Italy
- A United States citizen or a permanent resident alien
- Applicant must be a member of NIAF. \$30 student memberships are available. Membership provides access to scholarships, educational programs and events.
- For purposes of being selected for the guaranteed SFIAC slot, you must be a current SFIAC member or the child or grandchild of a SFIAC member in good standing.

International roundtrip airfare, meals, accomodations, tours, admissions and transportation.


















Nominations, Elections for Directors

*Please note the election process may be altered after the upcoming November bylaws meeting

It's time to select our directors for 2023! Article VI, Section I, B, of the Club Bylaws states: "Nominations for all offices, Board of Directors, Board of Trustees and Club Officers, shall be open to the general membership at a special meeting on the first and second Tuesday in January. Nominees must be present to accept or decline their nomination."

As many of the board seats will be vacant and some board members cannot run again, this year's election is extremely important.

Article VI, Section 2, B of the Club's Bylaws states: "Ballots must be cast at the Club premises between the hours of 1:30 PM and 9:00 PM." For additional Bylaws election information, visit www.sfiac.org.

Your participation in nominations and elections is crucial for the Club to function. This is the one Club function that all members should attend, if only to meet the candidates. Please mail in your ballot or plan to be at the Club to vote. All members will receive a ballot in the mail – please be sure the Club office has your current mailing address! You do not need to physically cast your ballot on-site on election day, but may still do so if you like. All ballots must be filled out and received by the SFIAC on or before January 24, 2023.

Strict Voting Procedures

A. No candidate, for any office, shall solicit votes in writing and any candidate so doing shall be disqualified and his name removed from the ballot. Any and all candidates for all offices may solicit for votes prior to election day. No candidate may solicit votes on the day of the election or within 100 feet of the premises. Any candidate found violating this article would automatically be disqualified from the election

B. Mailings are sent to members and handled in the following manner to insure security and privacy:I) Each member is assigned a number.

- 2) Each mailing will contain the following:
 - a. Ballot
 - b. Return envelope

c. Ballot envelope (a smaller return envelope with stamped number assigned per instruction #1 above.)

3) Each member completes ballot.

4) Each member submits ballot in either of the two following ways:

a. Member drops off in person his sealed ballot envelope with ballot enclosed into election ballot box.

b. Member mails sealed ballot envelope - with marked ballot enclosed - inside of pre-addressed return envelope.

5) At the time ballot envelopes are received, either by mail or in person at the Club, the number assigned to the member is checked off.

6) All sealed ballot envelopes are inserted into the election ballot box.

7) All ballots must be submitted and inserted into the election ballot box by 9:00 PM on election day.

IMPORTANT: Member should not have his name on ballot or on the ballot envelope for anonymous voting.




